




Areas with Low Socioeconomic



Barriers to eating healthy








Average median household income




% of families with income below 200% of poverty level




Monroe County Low wage workers bear the brunt of COVID pain

Promising responses

- Coordinated Approach to Child Health (CATCH) evidence-based physical activity program in some schools
- Nourish NY (NYN) a 'best practice' program developed by CCE in Albany
- **Community Schools** food pantries for students, families and community members
- Baby Cafe in Newark
- Healthy Living programs National Diabetes Prevention Program (NDPP) and Chronic Disease Self-Management (CDSM)
- Prescription food program at Newark Wayne Community Hospital
- Youth Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) for adults interacting with youth including law enforcement and roll out for grades 10th and 11th
- Adult MHFA for adults interacting with adults

Wayne County residents' health fears

"MENTAL HEALTH!!! There is not enough support, education, appointments, etc."

> "I haven't been to the doctor/dentist in so long; and I'm afraid to go and find out something is wrong."

"We run out of well water in the hot summer months ... I fear for health issues that arise and not having water for, say, wound care, ... it's hard to shower from a milk jug." "My husband and I are getting older. My biggest fear is having to do without him."

"Not having health care insurance, not able to afford it and not eligible to receive assistance to afford it, I work crazy hours [and] still I can not afford all my medical needs and or dental needs. I will one day have a major health event and more than likely die because of it. I am truly stuck in the middle of it all."
