**Workshop Goal:** This course follows a job-imbedded model for improvement and change. The goal is for each participant to finish the workshop with a framework for an implementable plan to challenge elements of institutional racism within their locus of control be it classroom, school, or district. There will be follow-up sessions during the 2024-2025 school year to discuss progress on participants' plans. The meeting dates for the follow-up sessions will be mutually scheduled by the last day of the workshop on August 23, 2024.

**Workshop Overview:** The **Anti-Racism Educational Change Workshop** is designed to provide an opportunity for practicing teachers, administrators, and staff members to broaden their understanding of how structural, institutional, and individual racism operates

in schools and society. The workshop will:

- Provide an historical review of how racism has operated in our nation and schools.
- Provide an historical review of how racism has impacted non-White students in schools.
- Show examples of how oppressed people in America have grappled with racism and consistently succeeded in our nation and schools.
- Review and analyze challenges that non-White students experience in schools today.
- Explore techniques schools and teachers employ to develop institutional cultures where quality race relations exist, and students of color and their peers thrive.
- Develop participants' skills in negotiating cultures other than their own.
- Build participants' capacities to facilitate conversations on racial justice.

The goal of the workshop is for each participant to develop implementable anti-racism instructional lessons and activities to challenge elements of institutional racism within their locus of control.

The workshop is part of WARE's Anti-racism Professional Development Project.

### Naloxone Training

This course will teach you how to recognize the signs of an opioid overdose and administer the opioid overdose reversal drug Naloxone.

- · Offered in-person
- 30-45 minute course (group), 15 minute course (individual)
- Open to individuals 18+

### Adult Mental Health First Aid

Teaches participants how to identify, understand and respond to signs and symptoms of mental health challenges and substance use disorders.

### It's Real: Teens and Mental Health

The program raises awareness about mental health issues, how to start a conversation about mental health, the importance of self-care, and how to reach out for help.

- Gardening Hotline: During the growing season (April- end of October) Master
  Gardeners are in the office on Tuesdays and Fridays from 9 a.m. to noon for
  questions, to look at plant and insect samples, and for soil pH testing. Nov. 1<sup>st</sup> end
  of March, we respond to questions left on our voicemail or emailed to us. People can
  email questions to: or leave a message on our voicemail (315) 331-8415, ext. 107
- Plant and insect samples can be brought to our office (1581 Rte. 88 North, Newark),
   M-F from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Insects should be submitted in a clean plastic container (so they won't get crushed) and plant samples in sealed plastic bags.
   Containers should be labeled with the client name and daytime phone number. This service is free.
- Soil Testing: Our Master Gardeners complete soil pH testing for \$3.00 per sample. We also provide soil nutrient test submission forms and instructions and can assist with completing the forms and with soil test result interpretation.
- Horticultural Presentations: Available to groups of 10 or more in Wayne County. For information on topics or to schedule a presentation, <u>contact us</u>.
- Community and School Garden Liaison Project: We provide troubleshooting for plant problems, guidance for planting and maintenance, and seeds/plants, when available, to participating sites. Please contact us for more information.
