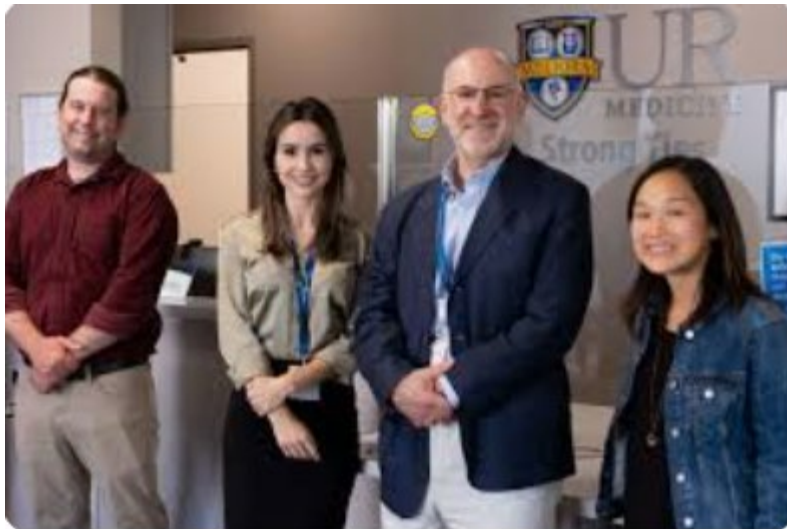

The **URMC Intercept Clinic** is specifically designed for individuals, ages 15 to 28 years old, who are experiencing worrisome changes in their thoughts, experiences, and/or feelings. Our mission is to help assess for and treat symptoms which are sometimes prodromal for psychosis (first time symptoms emerging before a full psychotic episode) and to prevent the development of a first episode of psychosis, as well as serious and persistent mental health illnesses. Through Intercept, young people can learn to identify, monitor, and manage changes in their behavior and mental health that may be at-risk signs of serious mental illness. Treatment components are tailored to the individual and can include individual and group therapy, medication management, peer support, and more. We aim to provide services and supports that will help minimize disruptions to the young person's ability to engage in school, work, and relationships as well as support their personal health and wellness goals. The Intercept Clinic offers comprehensive outpatient mental health treatment, including individual psychotherapy, medication management, group -therapy, marriage and family therapy, as well as a variety of optional research projects that patients can opt to participate in. Climate Solutions Accelerator of the Genesee-Finger Lakes Region is looking for a part-time (15-25 hrs/week) intern to work with us from May through August this year on doing public engagement around clean energy in our region, with a focus on rural communities. The **attached document** has more details about the position.

To be eligible for this internship, which is funded through NYSERDA, someone needs to meet at least one of the following eligibility criteria:

- Individuals who are currently attending or have attended a degree program at a college or university located in New York State within the last 12 months as of the date of the intern application.
- New York State residents attending or who have attended a degree program at a college or university outside of New York State within the last 12 months as of the date of the intern application. New York State residency, with proof of residency such as rental agreement or utility bills, must have been established prior to the start of the internship. Interns moving to the state for an internship do not qualify for funding under this PON.
- New York State residents who are 16-24 years of age and who are members of a Disadvantaged Community and/or Priority Population.
