

### New Tool Helps Youth Remove Sexually Explicit Images from the Internet

The new <u>Take It Down</u> tool helps combat child sexual exploitation by enabling youth to remove sexually explicit images of themselves from the Internet. Developed by the <u>National Center for Missing & Exploited Children</u>, an OJJDP grantee, Take It Down works by generating a unique digital fingerprint—a "hash value"—that identifies copies of sexually explicit images or videos. The launch of this tool comes as <u>law enforcement</u> agencies are reporting a dramatic rise in a crime known as <u>sextortion</u>—when children and

teens are coerced into sending explicit images online and then extorted for money or additional explicit material. Perpetrators often release the images even after youth send additional images or money—typically, hundreds of dollars or more.

Sextortion can occur after a child has shared an image with someone they trusted, but many children are targeted by strangers posing online as peers, often using fake accounts and communicating via popular social media sites, gaming sites, or video chat applications. **Take It Down is a free service.** Youth select the content they want "hashed," and the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children shares the unique identifier with participating online platforms, which then scan their public or unencrypted sites and apps and remove the images. Users can remain anonymous and the image or video they identify remains on their device; they do not need to upload it. Participating platforms include Facebook, Instagram, and multiple pornographic websites. Meta (the parent company of Facebook and Instagram) provided initial funding for Take It Down's development."

Rochester Regional Health offers paid Certified Nursing Assistant (C.N.A.) Training. This free training program is a five week long commitment and is comprised of both classroom instruction and hands-on clinical experiences. The program also offers an education stipend to support you while you're training. After program completion, trainees will be eligible for employment in our long term care facilities. Students will not work while in program.


What is a C.N.A? A Certified Nursing Assistant provides direct health care needs to patients, often under the supervision of a nurse. C.N.A responsibilities include feeding, monitoring the health of patients, bathing, dressing, grooming, toileting and specimen collection.

The C.N.A. Trainee role is a transitional, entry-level position designed to train on the necessary skills required to become a Certified Nursing Assistant (C.N.A). Candidates hired into this position are required to take and pass the C.N.A Training Class and state mandated test in order to earn their C.N.A Certification.


