


A Healthier Future Begins with Children

Summer EBT is based on USDA's Summer EBT for Children demonstration projects and Pandemic EBT, which have been proven to reduce child hunger and improve diet quality.

Summer EBT benefits will come in the form of pre-loaded cards that families can use to purchase groceries. Beginning in summer 2024, families will receive \$40 per eligible child, per month. These benefits work together with other available FNS nutrition assistance programs, such as summer meal sites, SNAP, and WIC, to help ensure kids have consistent access to critical nutrition when school is out.

Looking to support your local community?

Annually, communities across the country conduct comprehensive counts of the local homeless population to measure the prevalence of homelessness in each local Continuum of Care. The data collected provides a "snapshot" of the homeless population and demographics. The Count approximates the number of people experiencing homelessness in each community and collects information on individuals and families residing in emergency shelters and transitional housing.

The Point In Time (PIT) event is designed to allow people who are experiencing homelessness to express their specific needs and housing status to a group of staff and volunteers.

We are seeking to connect available volunteers with their local county PIT Lead, who will then guide them in conducting outreach interviews with homeless and unsheltered individuals in Ontario, Seneca, Yates, and Wayne Counties on January 31st.

<u>FLACRA</u> is coordinating these efforts across the region. <u>Donna Johnson</u> is leading this project in Wayne County. Please contact her if you are interested in helping with this important data collection.

Volunteers are meeting at <u>Finger Lakes Community Action</u> located at 159 Montezuma Street, Lyons at 5:30 on Wednesday, January 31st.

We are hoping for enough volunteers to send out 5-6 teams of 2-3 people each.

Family Counseling Services of the Finger Lakes offers the following programs and services to support LGBTQ+ individuals. Please share as needed.

For youth, we offer YANA (You Are Not Alone), a virtual support group every Monday from 4-5. This group is for LGBTQ+ (including questioning) youth from ages 10-18. Staff can contact us directly if they know of youth who would like to join (we would just need a release of information to talk to the youth/family) or the youth (or likely their parents/caregivers) can reach out to us directly. Youth conduct a brief intake with our staff before attending their first group, and then receive the Zoom link for group! <u>YANA Flyer</u>

For adults, we offer Haven, which is our LGBTQ+ support group for anyone over 18, and the Trans and Gender Expansive Coalition of the Finger Lakes, which is a support group for any transgender or gender-questioning folks over 18. Haven meets the 2nd and 4th Thursday of each month from 5-6 pm, and Trans and GE meets the 2nd and 4th Wednesday of each month from 6-7 pm. These two groups are hybrid – in person in Geneva or over zoom. We are also planning to start Square One soon, a group for parents or loved ones of LGBTQ+ people to ask questions and seek support. We will keep you posted on schedule and topics for this group as we get it up and running. I'll include all the group flyers as attachments – the intake processes for these groups would be the same as YANA. Haven Flyer

Our advocates are available to meet with any LGBTQ+ individual to provide emotional support and answer questions, to advocate for individuals (for example, to help with DASA reporting in school, provide emotional support around bullying/harassment, or help a transgender person collaborate with their school or workplace to meet their needs), and to connect folks to/help folks navigate additional resources (for example, walking someone through the legal process of changing their name, or helping someone access affirming

therapy). Advocates can meet with parents/caregivers/support people to provide education and resources and to answer questions as well. If you have any questions about what advocates can assist with, please feel free to reach out to us!

The team also offers **Safe Zone trainings**, which are informational workshops around LGBTQ+ issues, terminology, and allyship. The Safe Zone training is pretty thorough and in-depth, but we can also offer shorter or more specifically tailored trainings. Our coordinator Emily is the main contact person for setting up trainings. In addition, if anyone has questions about anything LGBTQ+ related, we're always happy to answer questions, brainstorm, troubleshoot, or whatever you need!

The Lead Renovator program is 8 contact hours with classroom and hands-on activities and an examination. There is an upcoming ASIST training at Wayne Behavioral Health Network, 1519 Nye Rd., Lyons from 8:30-4:30 on both April 29th-30th.

ASIST is a two-day intensive, interactive, and practice-dominated course designed to help caregivers recognize and review risk, and intervene to prevent the immediate risk of suicide. It is by far the most widely used, acclaimed and researched suicide intervention training workshop in the world. ASIST prepares caregivers of all kinds to provide suicide first aid interventions.

In this workshop you will have an opportunity to explore your experiences with and your attitudes about suicide. You will also have an opportunity to better understand the needs of a person at risk of suicide and learn how to use suicide first-aid to meet those needs.

15 Contact hours are available for SW and LMHC with a payment fee of \$62.24. Feel free to share this training with anyone 18 years old and up.
